WHO ARE WE?

SRHR Africa Trust (SAT) supports adolescents and young people in southern Africa to walk healthy, happy, confident & safe pathways to adulthood. We're a 30-year-old NGO, focused on young people, SRHR, and the drivers of adolescent health and wellness. All our programming is with young people and through young people, and our Youth Hubs and partner organisations link young people to one another, as well as linking them to health services, governments, the African Union Commission, and global agencies.

The Break Free Consortium

SAT is part of a consortium implementing the Break Free! Programme in a collaboration with Plan International and FAWE and funded by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Netherlands. The Break Free! programme is implemented across 9 countries in West, East, and Southern Africa, with the strategic objective being for adolescents, supported by civil society, to exercise their right to live free from Teenage Pregnancy (TP) and Child Marriage (CM).

The BF! Programme has three pathways of change leading towards the strategic programme objective; one of those is: 'Adolescents access quality SRHR information, education, and services. SAT has long focused on participative delivery of ASHR education, information, and services, and in support of Break Free we wish to strengthen this programming by reviewing and documenting key intervention implemented in the programme.

The Community Social Audit Scorecard Intervention

SAT, through Break Free! the program has been implementing the community social audits of SRHR services, teenage pregnancy and child marriage using a scorecard. This activity aims at monitoring impactful progress on SRHR services, teenage pregnancy, and child marriage in implementing countries and within project geographies. It is a monitoring tool that allows young people to assess the availability of protective policies, laws, and services for young people to thrive and reach their full potential.

The report will inform SAT on the best practices, progress, and challenges in the implementation of tool. The report is expected to be useful in the planning processes for the BF! Program and SAT-wide work.

The Consultant will carry out a **review of the social audit activity in Break Free countries to collate information and develop a programme wide report that highlights: methodologies used; stakeholders involved in the data collection process; stakeholders involved to discuss scorecard results; outcomes from the process; lessons learnt and recommendations.**

SPECIFIC TASKS:

The Consultant will perform the following specific tasks:

1. Consult program staff on the task to understand their expectations.
2. Review the social audit processes in BF country(s)
3. Develop a draft report capturing details in section 2 above.
4. Develop a final report incorporating all comments from the program staff after review of the draft.
5. Present findings to program staff using a PowerPoint presentation.

DELIVERABLES:

The deliverables of this assignment shall be as follows:

1. Draft report of the social audit intervention
2. Final Report of the social audit intervention
3. PowerPoint Presentation

TIME FRAME:

This task should be implemented in NOT more than 10 days.

- Minimum Master's in public health, Global Health, Development Studies, or any related field with at least 5 years progressive experience working in Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights/ child protection.
- Demonstrated understanding and experience of development/use of social audits in development work particularly in SRHR programming.
